<u>TREASURERS REPORT:</u> Report submitted by Burns. She stated that MI Class is paying 4.1% interest at this time. Burns made motion to accept the Treasurers report, Sheets second. Roll call vote, all ayes, motion carried

## CLERKS'S REPORT:

The Clerk presented a Profit and Loss statement for both the General and Fire Funds for the month of November 2022 along with payables. Motion by Sheets to accept report and pay the bills, seconded by Burns. Roll call vote, all ayes, motion carried.

<u>SUPERVISOR'S REPORT:</u> Supervisor stated Cathy Hahn Darcy Library Board appointment and the Friends of the Betsie Valley Trails Spark Grant resolution will be handled in new business. He also spoke with AJ's Excavating, they still plan on starting the trail this winter, but if not, we are first in spring. Township roads meeting will be January 11<sup>th</sup> 2023 @ 10am. Dec BOR will be last for Marc Rosseels as he is retiring. March BOR dates set. Organizational March 7<sup>th</sup>, Petitions March 13<sup>th</sup> 9-3pm and 14th 3-9pm. Jason expects a Sewer feasibility update in January. An ordinance amendment was initiated in 2017 for allowing vehicle towing businesses and impound yards. Over the years was lost track of. Jason will be reinvestigating.

- 1. FIRE CHIEF: Chief Adams reports for the month of November a total of 58 calls for service. Of which 20 were Fire, 38 for Medical, bringing YTD total to 520 calls.

The County website is being updated.
